Impact Statement to Georgia Environmental Protection Division (EPD)

**Subject:** Ongoing Environmental Nuisance and Health Impacts Resulting from Stockpiling and Spreading of Spent Soybeans Adjacent to Our Properties

To Whom It May Concern at the Georgia Environmental Protection Division:

We, the undersigned residents of Berrien County in Nashville, Georgia, submit this formal impact statement regarding the ongoing and severe environmental nuisance caused by the stockpiling, fermentation, and spreading of spent soybeans on properties purchased in 2022 by the current owner Dwight Caton and property manager Tony Kincaid. These activities have continued throughout 2023 and 2024 and remain ongoing despite previously issued Notices of Violation and the current negotiation of a Consent Order for continued non-compliance.

The following impacts represent daily and sustained harm to our health, safety, homes, and quality of life:

**1. Severe Odors and Inability to Breathe Normally**

The fermenting soybean waste produces overwhelming, putrid odors that make it difficult or impossible to breathe both inside and outside our homes. On many days, the air is so thick and nauseating that we are forced to remain indoors with windows sealed, yet even inside our homes, the odor often penetrates.

**2. Impact on Children, Grandchildren, and Outdoor Activity**

Children and grandchildren can no longer safely or comfortably play outside. The smell and the presence of insects make outdoor activity intolerable, restricting basic use and enjoyment of our properties.

**3. Health Symptoms and Mental Fatigue**

Many of us experience:

Daily headaches

Nausea

Mental exhaustion and stress from constant exposure

Fatigue associated with continuous odors and inability to air out our homes

These symptoms are directly correlated with the times and days the odors are most extreme.

#### 4. Property Use and Enjoyment Severely Limited

We are unable to:

Walk around our own yards

Sit on porches or enjoy outdoor spaces

Host family gatherings

Engage in normal daily activities due to air quality concerns

There has been a complete loss of normal use of our private property.

#### 5. Insects, Blow Flies, and Pest Infestations

Large numbers of insects—particularly blow flies—have overtaken our yards. These infestations occur even during colder months when insect activity should normally be low. The presence of these pests is both unsanitary and directly connected to the fermenting soybean waste.

#### Request for Continued and Strengthened Enforcement

Given the severity and duration of these impacts, we request that the Georgia EPD:

1. Document this impact statement as part of the current enforcement file and ongoing Consent Order proceedings.
