Dear Sir or Madam:

The following serves as the final report detailing the emergency response and corrective actions taken in response to the incident that occurred on October 14, 2015 at the above referenced location. Please see Appendix 1 (Site Map).

Incident Background:

On October 14, 2015, ERTS was contacted by Landstar Inway concerning a release of 10 gallons of antifreeze from a tractor on the bridge into the Savannah River caused by an accident. A truck carrying two portable toilets was pushed into the river by the Landstar Inway tractor. The portable toilets were empty. There were no soils impacted.

Emergency Response:

On October 14, 2015 Landstar Inway retained Emergency Response and Training Solutions (ERTS) to manage and oversee environmental operations on their behalf. ERTS dispatched Moran Environmental from Savannah, GA, to perform initial response and remediation activities.

Regulatory Notifications:

Pursuant to Haz: Code of Georgia, Title 12, Chapter 14, Section 12-14-3; Georgia Rules and Regulations, Chapter 391-3-19-.04 Petroleum: Georgia Rules and Regulations, Chapter 391-3-15-.08, incorporating 40 CFR 280, Subpart E, ERTS notified the Georgia Dept. of Natural Resources. Operator 142 received the call and provided reference # 78080.

Corrective Action:

On October 14, 2015, Moran Environmental personnel assessed the release. There was no evidence of antifreeze on the bridge. The release on the bridge was cleaned up by the Savannah Fire Department. Using a boat, Moran Environmental personnel recovered one of the portable toilets. The other portable toilet was not recovered.

Waste Disposal:

There was no waste generated from the release. The portable toilet was recycled back to the original owner, Nature's Calling, located in Charleston, South Carolina.

Conclusions and Recommendations:

No evidence was found that suggests any environmental impact remains on the site following corrective action. ERTS recommends that the incident be closed.
